
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# IMPACT ASSESSMENT

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The DLF CARES programme is currently supporting 1,813 students in 856 schools across 20 states in India. Scientific learning assessment tools were used for quantitative and qualitative feedback. Data was collected from key programme stakeholders: students, parents, teachers, and partner agencies across the country.
